Re: Myricom's Confidential and Proprietary Information

Dear Mr. Schweitzer:

It has recently come to Myricom's attention that on or around January 2, 2015, you published a LinkedIn blog post entitled "Google, Memcache, and How Solarflare May Have Come Out on Top" that contains confidential and proprietary information belonging to Myricom, Inc. Your disclosure of this information violates your continuing obligations under your Nondisclosure and Assignment Agreement ("Nondisclosure Agreement") with Myricom and subjects you to significant civil liability. The Company is currently exploring all available options to protect its interests in this regard. Please take immediate steps to delete your January 2 post and any other publication you may have made containing Myricom's confidential or proprietary information.

We understand that following your employment with Myricom, you joined Solarflare Communications. In light of the confidential information you published in your recent blog post, we would also like to take this opportunity to remind you more generally of your ongoing legal obligations to Myricom. During your employment, Myricom entrusted you with trade secret, confidential and proprietary information. Your Nondisclosure Agreement, as well as statutory and common law, prohibit you from using or disclosing any of Myricom's Proprietary Information to Solarflare or to anyone else, even though your employment with Myricom has ended. Myricom takes its rights with respect to its confidential, proprietary and trade secret information very seriously. Your unauthorized use or disclosure of this information could cause significant harm to Myricom and to its affiliates. Myricom is therefore prepared to take whatever steps are necessary to protect its information against such use or disclosure.
